Impact on the climate

The Amazon contains 90-140 billion metric tons of carbon - this is released if the forest is destroyed

Impact on nature

- The Amazon contains a third of tropical rainforests on Earth
- 10% of all plants & animals live here

Impact on people

The Amazon alone is home to more than 24 million people.

Impact on health

- Increases risk of future pandemics
- Deforestation increases contact with wild animals
- Industrial farming also increases risk

Industrial meat = Deforestation

What is industrial meat?

- Produced in huge quantities
- Causes environmental harm
- Majority of UK meat is industrial meat


Some startling statistics...



Dear Mr Murphy

Ten years ago, Tesco promised to decouple all its meat production from deforestation by 2020. As a Greenpeace activist and a Tesco customer, I am holding you to that promise. In this year alone, an area of Brazilian rainforest nearly the size of the UK has been burnt, just to make way for animal feed which is exported to meat producers around the world. By selling meat reared on animal feeds produced by JBS, or any of their affiliates, Tesco, and their customers, are bankrolling the large-scale destruction of virgin habitats – not only in the Amazon rainforest, but also the unique wetlands of Pantanal and the Cerrado savannah.

I am aware that Tesco are in the business of making money, not saving the planet. But allowing customers to enjoy guilt-free meat does not necessarily have to impact on profit – for example, if a wider range of meat-free alternatives are offered. People in the UK now eat 4 times as much meat per capita as in the 1960's, an increase which is neither sustainable nor healthy – or necessary.

I therefore ask that Tesco 1) sever all links between its supply chain and industrial meat and animal-feed production, 2) help their customers make the switch to eating less meat, and more plant-based alternatives, and 3) halve their meat sales by 2025.
